



## Additional Information and Resources in Marin County

The tool bar at the left includes "Recycling Guide" which is a searchable database where you may select a wide variety of materials and learn locations throughout the County where they may be recycled. Residents of Marin County, *with the exception of Novato*, may bring household hazardous wastes such as paint, adhesives, motor oil, pesticides, household batteries, latex paint, computer monitors, televisions, and bleach cleaners to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility in San Rafael free of charge. The facility is located at 565 Jacoby Street in San Rafael and is open Monday - Saturday, 8:00 am - 4:00 pm. Call 415-485-6806 for more information.
